

Pacific Islands Mental Health and Substance Abuse Inventory



PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP (PwC) is pleased to submit the Pacific Islands Mental Health and Substance Abuse Inventory. Our services were performed and this report was developed in accordance with our contract W81XWH-07-F-0212 dated July 29, 2008 and are subject to the terms and conditions included therein.

Our work was limited to the specific procedures and analysis described herein and was based on information primarily collected and available through September 30, 2008. Accordingly, changes in circumstances after this date could affect the findings outlined in this report.

I. Background and Purpose of Inventory

Force Health Protection and Readiness (FHP&R) has been requested by the Senate Appropriations Committee to compile an inventory of mental health and substance abuse resources available to Warriors, National Guard, Reserves, Retirees, Veterans, and their families/dependents in the Pacific islands of American Samoa, Guam, Hawaii, Northern Marianas, and Okinawa. There is particular interest in serving populations in remote or hard to reach locations.

The Psychological Health Working Group is an ad hoc Pacific Rim Mental Health Resources body which was formed to address this request and other elements of Warrior care and is composed of members from FHP&R, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), TRICARE, Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA), and other organizations. PH Working Group personnel and departments have contributed by supplying and validating much of the quantitative data and information used to build this report. Requirements for this inventory report were also provided by the PH Working Group.

This report is intended to serve as a foundation for mental health and substance abuse program planning at the Federal, State, and Local levels as appropriate. It is not intended to draw conclusions or provide assessment of resource levels within the area. It is expected that the data used in this report (e.g. military population, TRICARE utilization) will change and therefore should be considered a point in time from which to base planning and program activities.

II. Report Usage

This inventory report has been designed for use primarily as an Excel spreadsheet. Using the tabs and hyperlinks, program planners concentrating on specific topic areas can quickly find and act on the information provided. The report can also be used in printed form when the electronic format is not convenient or possible.

This report makes extensive use of grouped data fields which will allow users to drill down into information as necessary. Two "flex fields" have been added in Columns B and C to accommodate both numbers and percentages for program planners.

Maps - Individual islands and the overall Pacific region tab have accompanying maps which allow for quick visual representation of each clinic, treatment facility, or resource. The individual island map legend distinguishes between:

- Military/VA facilities & resources (Green)
- Civilian facilities & resources (White)
- Mental health resources (Orange)
- Substance abuse resources (Yellow)
- Additional Resources (Blue)

Note: The map section also includes a suggested primary treatment provider along with contact information and the corresponding number for section 1.3.

The overall Pacific Basin Map provides a visual locator for major educational facilities and potential telehealth/telemedicine partners within the region. The overall island map legend distinguishes between:

- Educational programs or resources (Blue)
- Medical schools (Red)
- Distance learning or telehealth programs (Yellow)

Data - The data table in Tab 14 is linked directly to individual island tabs. Rows within this tab may be expanded or collapsed by individual program planners to highlight the specific information they need. Doing this will also modify the output of the graphs to reflect the reduced/expanded information.

Acronym Dictionary - Tab 15 contains a listing of commonly used acronyms used through the inventory report.


